WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Transylvania County intends to adopt a budget ordinance making appropriations and levying taxes for the budget year beginning July 1st, 2022 and ending June 30th, 2023.

WHEREAS, the budget ordinance for the County of Transylvania shall comply with the requirements of NCGS 159-13 with regard to its form, adoption and limitations.

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the governing board of the County of Transylvania that the FY 2022-2023 budget ordinance is adopted as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby levied a tax at the rate of six thousand and three hundred and three hundreths of a cent (\$.6033) per one hundred dollars (\$100) valuation of property listed for taxes as of January 1, 2022, for the purpose of raising the revenues for the current year's levy as estimated in section 2 of this ordinance. Revenues are estimated based on the County Assessor's estimate of \$6,995,375,550 and an estimated collection rate of 99.50%.

SECTION 2. There is hereby levied a tax at a rate of five and a half cents (\$.055) per one hundred dollars of valuation (\$100), on property listed for taxation as of January 1, 2022 in each of the County's fire and rescue service districts. The estimated valuations and collection rates for each district are established in Schedule B of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to N.C. General Statute 153A-277 this ordinances levies fees for sales and services provided by County Departments according to Schedule \underline{C} of the budget ordinance.

SECTION 4. Pursuant to North Carolina S.L. 2005-88 and in accordance with NCGS 153A-155, there is hereby levied a five percent (5%) tax on gross receipts from the sales of taxable accommodations.

SECTION 5. Use fees for Solid Waste activity are hereby levied in amounts specified by Schedule B of the Budget Ordinance and in accordance with NC G.S. 153A-293.

SECTION 6. The Board of Commissioners hereby waives fees which would otherwise be imposed on County departments or agencies during their normal day-to-day operations.

SECTION 7. The Board of County Commissioners delegates to the County Manager the authority to waive on a discretionary basis up to fifty percent of the value of any fee which would be imposed on another government unit by this ordinance. A report of any such waivers shall be entered into the minutes of Commissioners.

SECTION 8. The County of Transylvania adopts a budget ordinance for its general fund, according to Exhibit A of this resolution, which is hereby incorporated by reference as if fully setforth herein.

SECTION 9. The estimate of revenues and appropriations of expenditures for all other funds are adopted, according to Exhibit B of this ordinance, which is incorporated by reference as if fully setforth herein.

SECTION 10. The County Manager is hereby designated as the Transylvania County Budget Officer and authorized to transfer appropriations within and between funds contained herein subject to the following guidelines and restrictions:

- (1) The Manager may transfer amounts between expenditure line items within a department without limitation and without a report being required.
- (2) The Manager may transfer amounts up to \$50,000 between departments within the general fund. An official report on such transfers exceeding \$10,000 shall be provided to the Board of Commissioners on at least a quarterly basis.
- (3) The County Manager may initiate transfers of up to \$50,000 from the General Fund. Reports on such transfers will be provided by the Finance officer on a quarterly basis and must be approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

SECTION 11. Appropriations to local education agencies, nonprofit agencies or other governments authorized by this ordinance are to be undertaken according to the following policies of the Board of Commissioners:

- a) The County Finance Officer shall distribute appropriations to the Transylvania County Schools General Fund and Capital Project Fund in twelve monthly installments.
- a) The Board of Commissioners has exercised the right to appropriate its outlays to the Capital Project Fund of Transylvania County Schools according to project and purpose.
- c) Appropriations for projects which exceed a monetary value of \$50,000 shall only be released to Transylvania County Schools only after the County Manager has received appropriate documentation that substantiates the project has been placed under contract by Transylvania County Schools.
- d) Appropriations to volunteer fire and rescue agencies shall be made quarterly.
- e) Appropriations to other nonprofit corporations shall be made annually or quarterly.

SECTION 12. The Finance Officer may advance resources between the funds of the County only as authorized by the Board of Commissioners.

SECTION 13. The County Manager and the Finance Director are hereby designated as the County officials whose endorsements shall appear on financial instruments related to the financial activity of the County undertaken with this Budget Ordinance.

SECTION 14. The County Manager is hereby authorized to purchase or enter into contract to construct or renovate capital items which are understood to be authorized within this ordinance. The County Manager amend this ordinance to authorize construction or acquisition of capital assets as long as resources are available and unobligated up to a limit of \$10,000.

SECTION 15. The Chairman of the Board of Commissioners and the County Manager are authorized to execute all contracts/agreements which are within the scope of this budget ordinance.
