A. Community Grants Program Land of Materials TRANSYLVANIA — COUNTY— NORTH CAROLINA







Grant Eligibility

- In the FY 23-24 Budget, Commissioners allocated \$60,000 to form a grant program to support community centers pending policy and process development
- Program supports strategic plan by building partnership with community centers that provides opportunities for expansion of services the county can offer and improvement to publicly accessible facilities
- Program clarifies eligibility requirements and criteria to make application for grant funding
- Eligible community centers must have 501(c)3 incorporation and demonstrate they meet 4 of the 5 criteria in order to be eligible for funding:
 - 1. Hold elections for center board officers
 - 2. Hold at least quarterly meetings of their board with minutes taken and available for review
 - 3. Hold at least 6 events annually open to the public
 - 4. Publish at least 6 articles pertaining to their activities in The Transylvania Times
 - 5. Maintain an up-to-date website, Facebook or other social media page



Community Center Support Grant Program

Grant Parameters

- Meeting criteria will demonstrate community center is <u>active</u> enough that the County can guarantee
 expenditure of public funds will be successful development of publicly accessible community resources
 and services the county can provide under legislative restrictions.
- Successful applicants will enter into a contract with County which will govern the requirements of expending funds and reporting, similar to the process by which County funds nonprofits
- Proposed \$60,000 broken into 3 separate grant programs
 - Connected Public Space Grants reimbursement for full cost of investments in communications infrastructure
 with goal of creating wireless internet hotspots and providing support for keeping these spaces open and
 accessible to the public for that purpose.
 - Public Health/Public Safety Grants \$2,500 grant awarded on competitive basis for up to 4 eligible projects that provide material health or safety improvements and demonstrate commitment by providing 10% match.
 - Public Purpose Grants- \$7,500 grant awarded on competitive basis for up to 2 projects with a public purpose, such as programming for children, youth or families or capital improvement expenses; requires 10% match of the full cost of the project.

Grant Review Process

- Applications to be reviewed by committee of representatives across County government, including up to 2 Commissioners, the County Manager, Finance Director, representatives from Planning and Community Development, and from Maintenance and Engineering
- Administration of grant program with responsibility for monitoring contract and performance by Planning and Community Development department


Grantee Requirements


- · Will be required to sign a contract
- · Will be required to make anything funded with county dollars open to the public for use/benefit
- · May be required to host county services a minimum number of times per year without a facility fee
 - Project upcoming to explore remote provision of county services.
- Funds are not guaranteed year to year
- Elections Center will pay usage fees for voting precinct usage only

Noise Control Ordinance



:

- > Current Noise Ordinance was adopted in 2008 and amended in 2013.
- > The Planning Board was directed to review and propose potential amendments in late 2018.

Noise Control Ordinance Revision Process

The Transylvania County Planning Board:

- Reviewed the current Noise Control Ordinance
- Discussed potential revisions with the Sheriff's Office and County Attorney
- Considered revisions at multiple meetings in 2019
- > Received public input
- Considered additional revisions based on public feedback and comments from the Sheriff's Office and County Attorney
- Recommended a draft version for the County Commissioners Consideration on October 17, 2019

Significant Changes:

- New Definition of what defines a "disturbing noise":
- " a noise that annoys, disturbs, injures, or endangers the comfort, health, peace, or safety of a reasonable person of ordinary sensibility
- Amended the regulations on how to determine if a noise is in violation (location of measurement, duration, decibels, timeframe, practicability)
- Measurements taken at the complainant's curtilage closest to the noise
- Noise level has to exceed the decibel limit for more than 50% of the time measurement. (Three (3) readings in less than 10 minutes exceeding ambient noise level by 15 decibels for a total of 65 decibels during the night hours and 75 decibels during the day.)
- If not practicable, it can't exceed 65 decibels at night and 75 decibels during the day
- Amended exempted noises including "firearms used for lawful recreational purposes"
- Amended prohibited noises (violating noises exceeding 65 or 75 decibels depending on whether at day or night)
- Added clarifying language on noises from dogs and farm operations

Noise Control Regulations

ARTICLE I SHORT TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the Noise Control Ordinance of Transylvania County,

ARTICLE II

AUTHORITY

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority and provisions of the General Statutes of the State of North Carolina Article 6, Chapters 153A-121 and 153A-133.

ARTICLE III

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish an effective means of regulating and controlling loud and disturbing sound and noise within Transylvania County to promote the health, safety and general welfare for its citizens.

ARTICLE IV

JURISDICTION AND ADMINISTRATION

This Ordinance shall apply to all areas of Transylvania County located outside the boundaries of any incorporated city or town. Transylvania County Noise Ordinance is on file at the Transylvania County Clerk to the County Commissioners. NCGS § 153A-48 requires the ordinance to be kept on file with the clerk to the board. The Transylvania County Sheriff, or their appointee, shall be known as the Enforcement Officer.
